Missionaries to Scotland

Dear Pastor Harrill and Tulsa Baptist Temple,

Praise the Lord! We have our first convert! My daughter, Mia, accepted Christ as her Saviour this past Sunday morning. During the offering time, Mia started crying for no apparent reason. Barbara took her downstairs to see what was wrong. The next thing we know Mia wanted to ask Jesus to save her. She has been asking questions since my grandmother died last year. She has always been afraid of baptisms and told us she did not want to get saved because she did not want to get baptized. We knew the moment that she was willing to get baptized that she would be ready to get saved. Yesterday morning she finally let go and accepted Christ! After church, I spoke with her for a few minutes and asked her general questions about being saved. Long story short, she gave all the right answers. She is even willing to be baptized. When we got home, she wanted to call all her family members and friends to let them know that she got saved. Romans 10:11 says, *"For the Scripture saith, Whosoever believeth on him shall not be ashamed."*

As for the ministry, the Lord is opening a door for us to start a work in Scone. I know in our last letter we asked you to pray about the town of Arbroath. Since then we have continued to pray and visit other towns. In that process, the Lord led us to Scone. It is a couple of miles north of Perth and has many opportunities to reach people with the Gospel. Scone itself is a town of about 5,000, but with Perth just below it, there is an opportunity to reach thousands more with the Gospel. We met with another missionary couple who are in Perth, Russell and Janet Brinkley. They are like-minded missionaries. Bro. Russell asked me to pray about starting a work in Scone. We would be close enough to each other that we could help each other in the ministry, but far enough apart that we can have our own works. Bro. Russell and I met with the manager of the local community center in Scone. We would be able to rent a very nice facility for church services for less than \$200/month! Please pray for us as we begin to step through this door that God would prepare a way for us and that He would prepare the hearts of those that we will be witnessing to.

Moving to a new country with different cultures and climates can be hard at times. We have all been sick at different times over the past two months. I mentioned having knee problems in one of our prior prayer letters. Well, I had my MRI this past weekend and should expect the results back in the next couple of weeks. The worst case scenario is surgery and the best-case scenario is physical therapy to rebuild the muscles in my knee. We continue to ask that you would pray for our health and adjustment here. As always, continue to pray for us as we labor for the Lord.
