Missionaries to Greenland

Dear Praying Friends,

Thank you so much for your prayers for us over the last few months. I cannot even begin to express how grateful we are for them or how needed they have been. We were able to get a house in Greenland shortly after our last prayer letter. It wasn't a large house (16'x16') but it was a place where we would not have to be sharing with people we couldn't converse with.

Unfortunately for us, the house had a very old diesel furnace that didn't work very well. Some men came to clean it out one day and told us that the fuel lines were broken. It had been leaking fuel and they said that the whole unit needed to be replaced. They told us that we would be getting very sick from the fumes if we continued to stay there. We had been there for a month and there were no other places to rent. We were already sick with headaches, sinus infections, and trouble breathing (we just thought it was allergies) so we decided that it would be best to get back to America to see a doctor to make sure that we would be okay and no damage would be done.

I had become the sickest one from the diesel. I had dizziness, breathing trouble, headaches, and a sinus infection. Thankfully everyone else was not that bad. I got some medicine and am doing better now. Some things the doctor said would just take some time to wear off, and it seems that it has.

While in Greenland we were able to learn that the people there are eager to learn the Bible, but they want it done in their own language. I spoke with the school there and they told me that if I was able to speak Greenlandic, I would be able to use their youth building to work with the kids after school for whoever was interested. I was able to witness to some folks there that did speak English. Seeds have been planted. So, now our focus is on moving to Ilulissat to work with the Shull family and attend language school in the city of Sisimiut.

Our first two weeks in Greenland, there were three funerals. One of these was a young 22 year old named Qitora Bajare. she was one of the three that made a profession of faith on our last trip in 2006. She came down with cancer about a year ago and passed away while we were there. She left behind a four year old son, Julius. I attended her funeral at the little Lutheran church, where many people turned out. It was a very sad time. The people left there sad and hopeless not knowing the saving Gospel and I had no way to communicate it to them. It really was a sad time.

We need to raise \$1,000 a month more in support so that we will be able to live and operate in Ilulissat and attend language school. Please pray for us as we continue on the trail, desiring to see the Gospel spread throughout Greenland. Lord bless you and thank you so much for your prayers and support.
